

EHSS offers students the opportunity to gain an entry-level qualification in the health care and social services field, while undertaking structured workplace experience to develop practical skills and experience in the field.

EQIP partners with Gladstone SHS, Toolooa SHS, and Tannum Sands SHS to provide year 11 and 12 students an opportunity to complete HLT23215: Certificate II in Health Support Services with SDS Training (RTO 32505). Students remain enrolled at their base school and attend training one day per week for face-to-face theory and a variety of practical training in a simulated environment. EQIP works with the local community to arrange structured work experience to help students apply the learning in an authentic workplace environment.

Build your career

Employment options in health care and social services may include roles such as nurse, aged care worker, personal carer, allied health assistant, pharmacy assistant, medical practice assistant or receptionist, support service worker, pathology assistant or courier. *Further tertiary study will be required for some of these roles.*

Pathway to Health Support Services



Open to Year 11 and Year 12 students - the HLT23215: Certificate II in Health Support Services with SDS Training (RTO 32505) is an entry-level qualification that meets industry needs. This qualification covers workers who provide support for the effective functioning of health services.

Certificate delivery format

There is a total of 10 days face-to-face delivery time for all units of competency and the maximum number of students per group is 15. The training will be delivered over 2 terms of the 2018 school year.


Structured work experience

Students complete between 5 to 10 days structured work experience with host employers. The work experience is aligned to the unit of competency and is an assessable component of the course. Students will demonstrate and develop baseline skills relevant to the qualification and industry. Structured work experience will be tailored to suit individual and host employer needs.


Develop behavioural skills

EHSS students participate in the EQIP Career Development Program (CDP) designed to better prepare students for recruitment and selection, future employers and the workforce in general. Students learn about key behavioural skills and how they can identify and develop these skills through work experience. These include communication, teamwork, planning and organising, time management, problem solving, and initiative.

Upon successful completion of all units of competencies in the course, students will be issued with a certificate. Should a student not complete the entire course then a Statement of Attainment will be given for the units successfully completed.



Application and Selection Process

EQIP undertake a rigorous and consistent recruitment and selection process to ensure that our students are the best fit for the program. When submitting the 'Expression of Interest' form, please attach a current student resume, teacher references and the latest report card. While it is recommended that students have a pass in Maths and English, other factors are taken into account such as behaviour and effort. Offers will be made in Term 4 of the current school year for the next year intake. Costs

Student levies are reviewed on an annual basis to ensure that the fees are reasonable and can cover a portion of the costs that are incurred through delivery of EQIP Programs on campus or off-site at our specialised learning facilities. VETiS Qualification

Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) focuses on delivering qualifications to provide students with the skills and knowledge required for specific industries. From 1 July 2014, the VET investment budget provides funding for one (1) qualification fee-free in a skills shortage area for students enrolled in schools. The CII PMA is on the Queensland Training Subsidies list and students participating in this program will do this fee-free. That is provided the students have not already used their one qualification fee-free funding.
